§ 45-1. Prohibited growths.

From and after the passage of this chapter, it shall be unlawful for any person, association, partnership or corporation, or any agent thereof, to permit any noxious weeds and similar vegetation not edible or planted for use or ornamental purpose to grow or remain on any premises owned or occupied by such person, association, partnership or corporation, or agent thereof, in the Borough of Langhorne Manor.

§ 45-2. Proof of violation.

Proof that weeds or similar vegetation at least eight (8) inches in height are standing on property within the Borough of Langhorne Manor shall be prima facie evidence that noxious weeds are permitted to grow and remain on premises in violation of § 45-1 of this chapter.

§ 45-3. Removal; collection of costs.

All weeds or similar vegetation permitted to grow or remain on property within this borough in violation of the provisions of this chapter are declared to be nuisances and removable as such, and the cost of removal, with penalties, shall be collected by municipal lien or in any other manner authorized by law.

§ 45-4. Violations and penalties. [Amended 8-13-1974 by Ord. No. 102]

Any owner or owners, occupant or occupants of any property within this borough who shall violate any provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.) or to imprisonment in the county jail for a term of not more than thirty (30) days, or both. The continuation of such violation for each successive day shall constitute a separate offense, and the person or persons allowing or permitting the continuation of the violation may be punished as provided above for each separate offense.
